Anglo-Saxon kingdoms

The Anglo-Saxons formed many regions each with one ruler, known as kingdoms

Shire reeve

The peace officer of a shire, later known as 'sheriff'.

A lower-class Anglo-Saxon but better than a slave

longship

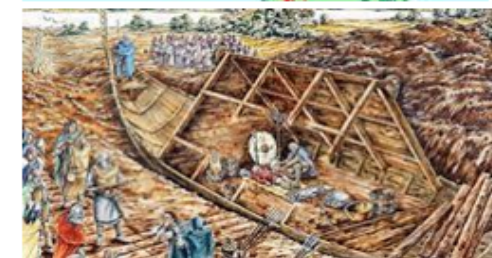
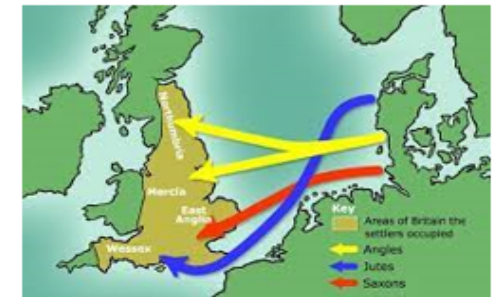
The narrow boat used by Vikings to raid along coasts

A large hall-like building where many Viking families would live together

Jorvik

The Viking name for the city of York. York now has a famous Viking museum called Jorvik
